The Department of Homeland Security is planning to purchase warehouses in 23 US cities to turn them into jails to **kidnap, cage, and disappear** immigrants. The government wants to deport 1 million people a year here on out.

Right now, there are **75,000 people in ICE custody**, which is a new record. The additional 23 sites would give the agency another 76,500 beds, bringing the **total number to over 150,000**. The ICE director aims to make these detention centers “like Amazon...but with people.”

Two new ICE warehouse prisons could open in GA in <60 days.

The warehouse in Social Circle, GA could hold 10,000 people, almost double the capacity of the largest current ICE detention center. The facility in Oakwood, GA plans to hold 1,500 people.

Stewart Detention Center (SDC) in Lumpkin, GA has been notorious **for human rights violations** since 2006. Detainees are forced to sleep on concrete floors in cramped rooms. Detainees are denied mental health support, important medications, chemotherapy, and pregnant women are denied crucial care. There have been dozens of reports of sexual assault at the hands of ICE employees inside SDC. At the recently reopened GA Irwin Detention Center, women were subjected to invasive gynecological procedures without their consent. These prisons also use forced labor. In a case against the private, for-profit prison company CoreCivic that runs SDC, plaintiffs say they were forced to work for as little as \$1 per day. Those who resist are threatened and put in solitary confinement. This is modern slavery.

To fill these new ICE prisons, the amount of ICE abductions and political persecution would have to expand rapidly in Georgia in the coming months. This reflects a frightening shift towards fascism that we must fight with urgency.

We are against these new ICE jails because we oppose the warehousing of human beings. We will not sit by as our neighbors are abducted in the street. We will not allow for our neighbors and fellow students to be dehumanized and abused in concentration camps. We must stick together, defend our communities and fight against these new prisons.
